AUCKLAND COUNCIL UPDATE | COVID-19 Update #4| 26 March 2020

Lockdown enforcement

Last night we moved to <u>Alert Level 4</u>. This means everyone must now stay at home, except those providing essential services or those needing medical care or going to the supermarket. Police have said the majority of people are complying with the lockdown rules. The Police will have a visible presence in the community and people will be warned and challenged on whether they should be out.

If members of the public are concerned about people gathering together or breaching self-isolation they are asked to contact <u>nhccselfisolation@health.govt.nz</u> with details. It's recommended that all essential workers have identification when they move around the city.

As a reminder, public transport will be free on AT contracted services, and a <u>reduced timetable</u> will run during the lockdown so that essential workers can still travel.

Services for rough sleepers

Auckland Council is working with key agencies to ensure there is continued support for rough sleepers in Auckland. The inter-agency group is working to get essential information to rough sleepers such as the use of public facilities for shelter, toilets and showers and for food preparation, and providing support for continued outreach services.

Libraries wi-fi access

Wi-fi access has been switched off at all Auckland Council library sites in line with instructions for people to stay home and not congregate in public spaces. Our wi-fi services will return when the lockdown is complete.
